South Carolina Commission on Higher Education Academic Year (AY) 2022-23 Proviso 11.15 Abatements Report

Background

Per Proviso 11.15 of the fiscal year (FY) 2023-24 Appropriations Act, the S.C. Commission on Higher Education is required to produce a report that compiles the abatement information received from the state-supported institutions of higher learning.

Proviso Requiring Abatement Report

South Carolina General Assembly 125th Session, 2023-2024 A. 84 General Appropriations Act for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Ratified Version Part IB Operation of State Government

Section 11 – H030 – Commission on Higher Education

11.15. (CHE: Abatements) By November first of each year, state supported institutions of higher learning must submit to the Commission on Higher Education the total number of out-of-state undergraduate students during the prior fiscal year that received abatement of rates pursuant to Section 59-112-70 of the 1976 Code as well as the total dollar amount of the abatements received. The report must include the geo-origin of the student, class of the student, comprehensive listing of all financial awards received by the student, number of semesters the student has received the abated rate, as well as the athletic status of the student. The report must also include the calculation method used to determine the abatement amount awarded to students as well as the number of students that received educational fee waivers pursuant to Section 59-101-620. The Commission on Higher Education is directed to compile the information received from the state-supported institutions of higher learning into a comprehensive report and submit such report to the Chairman of the Senate Finance Committee and the Chairman of the House Ways and Means Committee by January fifth each year.

Related Code of Laws

Title 59 - Education Chapter 112 Determination of Rates of Tuition and Fees

SECTION 59-112-70. Abatement of rates for nonresidents on scholarship. waiver for students participating in international Sister-State agreement or student exchange programs.

(A) Notwithstanding other provisions of this chapter, the governing boards listed in Section 59-112-10A, are authorized to adopt policies for the abatement of any part or all of the out-of-state rates for students who are recipients of scholarship aid.

(B) State-supported colleges and universities, including the technical colleges, may waive the nonresident portion of tuition and fees for those students who are participating in an international Sister-State

agreement program which the Governor and the General Assembly have entered to promote the economic development of South Carolina. The nonresident fee waiver for the students is applicable only for those Sister-State agreements where South Carolina students receive reciprocal consideration. The Commission on Higher Education, through coordination with the State Fiscal Accountability Authority, will annually notify institutions of the Sister-State agreements eligible for the nonresident fee waiver. The credit hours generated by these students must be included in the Mission Resource Requirement for funding.

(C) State-supported colleges and universities that have an established and ongoing relationship in one or more degree programs with an international institution, the terms of which have been formally approved by the institution's board of trustees, and a relationship that includes regular arrangements for the enrollment of qualified students and the exchange of faculty between the institutions, although not necessarily in equal exchange numbers, may waive the nonresident portion of tuition and fees for nonresident students enrolled in the program.

Title 59 - Education Chapter 101 Colleges and Institutions of Higher Learning Generally Article 2 Public Institutions of Higher Learning

SECTION 59-101-620. Educational fee waivers.

A public institution of higher learning may offer educational fee waivers to no more than four percent of the undergraduate student body.

Abatement Trends

During Academic Year (AY) 2022-23, 18 South Carolina institutions of higher learning abated, or reduced, out-of-state tuition by a collective \$204.1 million, an increase of \$10.0 million compared to AY 2019-20, or an average annual increase of 1.7 percent. The amount abated in AY 2022-23 was, however, about \$550,000 less than AY 2021-2022, a 0.3 percent decrease. Of the 20 institutions that abated tuition during the past four academic years, nine institutions abated less tuition in AY 2022-23 compared to AY 2021-2022.

Since AY 2019-20, abatements in the aggregate have increased by about five percent. While eight institutions decreased the total amount of abatements since AY 2019-2020 (including six who declined by 10 percent or more) eight others have increased their total abatements by at least 20 percent or more, including one with a 172 percent increase and two with nearly an 80 percent increase each.

Table 2 provides additional information around abatement trends. While the total amount abated at each institution fluctuates year over year, it may be in part due to changes in out-of-state undergraduate enrollment. Table 2 shows the average amount of tuition abated per out-of-state student by each institution, from a low of \$2 over the four-year period to a high of \$11,945. While abatements in the aggregate have increased by about five percent since AY 2019-20, the average amount abated by the out-of-state undergraduate population has decreased by approximately five percent. This shows that while

institutions have been increasing their out-of-state undergraduate student populations, the amount of abated tuition has not increased at the same rate.

However, additional scrutiny may be warranted when looking at the four-year comprehensive and two-year University of South Carolina branch campuses. Of those fourteen institutions, ten have increased the average amount of out-of-state tuition abated since AY 2019-20 by an average of 23 percent. This may show that these institutions are using abatements to attract out-of-state students to support their overall enrollment.

Four Percent Fee Waivers – Number of Students that Received Educational Fee Waivers Pursuant to Section 59-101-620

Section 59-101-620 of the South Carolina Code of Laws limits the offering of fee waivers to no more than four percent of an institution's undergraduate student body. Based on data submitted by the institutions for AY 2022-23, 11 of the 33 public four-year and two-year institutions met this requirement. The institutions above the four-percent threshold granted fee waivers based on the amount of tuition revenue generated from undergraduate students rather than the headcount enrollment of undergraduate students.
