

# FY 2023-24 Lottery Expenditure, Verification, and Audit Report

## Background

Per Proviso 3.1 of the FY 2024-2025 Appropriations Act, the South Carolina Commission on Higher Education (CHE) is required to provide a summary report on the FY 2023-2024 lottery fund expenditures and the CHE's verification and audit activity to the Executive Budget Office, the Chairman of the Senate Finance Committee and the Chairman of the House Ways and Means Committee. Proviso 3.1 reads:

#### FY 2024-2025 Proviso 3.1. Excerpt


... the Commission on Higher Education shall provide a report to the Executive Budget Office, the Chairman of the Senate Finance Committee, and the Chairman of the House Ways and Means Committee by October first each year summarizing, by institution, how lottery funds were expended in the prior fiscal year, issues and concerns as well as institution responses to those issues and concerns discovered as a result of the commission's verification and/or audit activity during the prior fiscal year, if any.

## **Lottery Expenditures**

Lottery funds disbursed by the CHE for expenditures at the fund source, program and institutional levels are included in **Attachments A** and **A.2** and are reported by institutional sector in alphabetical order. Please note that in addition to lottery funds, disbursements were also made from the General Fund for the Palmetto Fellows Scholarships and Need-based Grant programs. To provide an accurate portrayal of funds expended for the scholarship and grant programs, CHE staff included all sources of funding. Additionally, verification activities are inclusive of all funding sources for awards made during the academic year.













## **Verification and Audit Activity**

During FY 2023-2024 the CHE outsourced its verification and audit activity with the CPA firm Cline Brandt Kochenower (CBK). CBK conducted Agreed Upon Procedures (AUP) engagements either for FY 2021-2022 or FY 2022-2023 awards made at the following twenty institutions: Anderson University, Clemson University, Coastal Carolina University, Francis Marion University, Furman University, Greenville Technical College, Horry-Georgetown Technical College, North Greenville University, Spartanburg Community College, Tri County Technical College, University of South Carolina-Aiken, University of South Carolina-Beaufort, University of South Carolina-Lancaster, University of South Carolina-Salkehatchie, University of South Carolina-Sumter, University of South Carolina-Union, University of South Carolina-Upstate, Winthrop University, Wofford College, and York Technical College. The AUP engagements included the review of initial eligibility, continuing eligibility, disbursements to student accounts, and record retention.

## **Summary of Issues and Concerns Identified**

Issues and concerns identified during the verification and audit activities related to eligibility and disbursement amounts. A total of 19 issues and concerns were noted: three at Anderson University, two at Coastal Carolina University, one at Francis Marion University, one at Furman University, two at Greenville Technical College, two at North Greenville University, three at Spartanburg Community College, one at Tri-County Technical College, two at University of South Carolina Upstate and two at York Technical College.

Eleven of the 19 issues and concerns resulted in required reimbursements totaling \$33,950 to the applicable scholarship program. Details of the issues and concerns, recommendation(s), and each institution's response(s) are documented in **Attachment B** and are reported by institutional sector in alphabetical order.

## Disbursement of SC HOPE Scholarship

#### Issues and Concerns

The institution disbursed a SC Hope Scholarship without obtaining the required affidavit from one student.

#### Recommendation

The institution is required to reimburse \$2,800 to the SC HOPE Scholarship Program for improperly awarding funds. The institution must also evaluate current policies and procedures to reduce the risk of awarding and disbursing prior to obtaining all required documentation.

#### Institution's Response

The University recently converted from using Power FAIDS to Workday as its financial aid management system. For the 22-23 academic year, some office procedures still had to be conducted in Power FAIDS despite all awarding being completed in Workday. Document tracking and management was one process that had activity occurring in both systems for that academic year. It is possible that the student did complete the affidavit and the scan was lost in the conversion between systems. Now that we are beyond the conversion, all required documentation is collected in Workday with the annual state certification form included as part of onboarding for all students for the coming academic year. Document management was greatly simplified for the 23-24 cycle with everything occurring in the Workday system. We concur with the recommendation and have already replaced the transitional procedures from the 22-23 cycle.

### Reconciliation of Palmetto Fellows Scholarship Program

#### Issues and Concerns

The institution invoiced but never disbursed a portion of the Palmetto Fellows Scholarship Program.

#### Recommendation

The institution is required to reimburse \$3,350 to the Palmetto Fellow Scholarship Program that was never disbursed. The institution must implement policies and procedures to ensure the state lottery programs are continuously reconciled at the end of each award period to ensure student disbursements, invoices to the CHE and information reported on CHEMIS agree.

### Institution's response

Management concurs with this finding and has requested the funds to be returned to the CHE. Reconciliations will be performed by financial aid staff on a semester basis.

## Reconciliation of SC LIFE Scholarship Program

#### Issues and Concerns

The institution invoiced but never disbursed a portion of the SC LIFE Scholarship Program.

#### Recommendation

The institution is required to reimburse \$5,000 to the SC LIFE Scholarship Program that was never disbursed. The institution must implement policies and procedures to ensure the state lottery programs are continuously reconciled at the end of each award period to ensure student disbursements, invoices to the CHE and information reported on CHEMIS agree.

#### Institution's response

Management concurs with this finding and has requested the funds to be returned to the CHE. Reconciliations will be performed by financial aid staff on a semester basis.

After the disbursement of funds, the institution subsequently obtained valid high school transcripts for both students and verified that it was appropriate for the students to receive the SC HOPE scholarships.

### Recommendation

The institution must evaluate all functional areas that impact how and when initial eligibility is determined and identify weaknesses that increase the risk of incorrect awarding and disbursing.

### Institution's Response

The institution will develop internal controls, such as annual trainings on transcript verification and routine audits of transcripts, to ensure transcripts meet criteria prior to awarding/disbursing SC HOPE scholarships.

#### Issues and Concerns

The institution awarded the SC LIFE scholarship to a student that did not meet two of the three academic requirements for initial eligibility. The student earned at least a 3.0 SC UGP GPA; however, the student did not rank in the top 30% of their graduating class nor did they have the test scores required available.

#### Recommendation

The institution is required to reimburse \$5,000 to the SC LIFE Scholarship Program for improperly awarding funds. The institution must evaluate all functional areas that impact how and when initial eligibility is determined and identify weaknesses in current policies and procedures to reduce the risk of incorrect awarding and disbursing.

#### Institution's Response

FMU agrees with this finding. FMU will send the \$5,000 for SC LIFE to the CHE. We awarded the student initially based on his first transcript and then when the final one came in, he was not eligible. FMU has enhanced the review process in two ways. The first way there will be now three individuals (Director of Financial Assistance, Assistant Director of Financial Assistance, and a Financial Assistance Counselor) reviewing the awards based on final transcripts. This will allow FMU to significantly increase the number of students that are reviewed for accuracy. The second way the director will now do a second level check of the students reviewed by the assistant director and the counselor.

#### Recommendation

The institution is required to reimburse \$2,500 to the SC LIFE Scholarship Program for an overpayment of funds. The institution must implement policies and procedures to ensure the state lottery programs are continuously reconciled at the end of each award period to ensure student disbursements, invoices to the CHE and information reported on CHEMIS agree.

#### Institution's Response

Every term after Furman University receives funding from the CHE, the state coordinator reconciles the state aid programs to guarantee alignment. The Power FAIDS awards, Workday disbursements, invoices, and the CHE funds paid will all be compared throughout the reconciliation process. The institutional research and reporting associate director will meet with the state coordinator following reconciliation to update CHEMIS. The state coordinator will then confirm completion of the CHEMIS update and reconciliation via email to the senior associate director of financial aid.

One student did not return to the institution and lost their remaining eligibility. The other student lost their remaining eligibility.

#### Recommendation

The institution must evaluate all functional areas that impact how and when continued eligibility is determined and communicated to scholarship recipients.

## Institution's Response

The individual who managed the Palmetto Fellows (PF) program is no longer employed at GTC. The program is now managed by our LIFE coordinator. I feel confident in her abilities and attention to detail and do not expect any further such issues with PF.

#### Recommendation

The institution is required to reimburse \$2,800 to the SC Hope Scholarship Program for the incorrect awarding of the disbursement and make all necessary and appropriate adjustments to the student's 2022-2023 award period. The institution must evaluate all functional areas that impact how and when initial eligibility is determined and identify weaknesses in current policies and procedures to reduce the risk of incorrect awarding and disbursing.

### Institution's Response

North Greenville University has added a final transcript checklist to our process. They believe this is an isolated incident, but the final transcript checklist will be a proactive approach that will help prevent similar incidents from occurring in the future.

#### Reconciliation of SC LIFE Scholarship Program

#### Issues and Concerns

The institution invoiced but never disbursed a SC LIFE Scholarship. The institution did not return the unused funds to the CHE for the cancelled scholarship.

#### Recommendation

The institution is required to reimburse \$2,500 to the SC LIFE Scholarship Program that was never disbursed. The institution must implement policies and procedures to ensure the state lottery programs are continuously reconciled at the end of each award period to ensure student disbursements, invoices to the CHE and information reported on CHEMIS agree.

## Institution's Response

A staffing transition in 2022-2023 led to the oversight of not returning the \$2,500 SC LIFE scholarship for one of our students. We have since implemented an end-of-the-AY reconciliation in addition to the already established end-of-semester reconciliation. We do not foresee this issue to occur in the future.

## Spartanburg Community College Academic Year 2022-2023

#### SC LIFE Scholarship Initial Eligibility

#### Issues and Concerns

The institution did not properly identify the student's initial term of eligibility and omitted a student's initial SC LIFE Scholarship of \$2,500 during the Spring 2022 semester.

#### Recommendation

The institution must make the necessary and appropriate adjustments to award the student with the SC LIFE Scholarship in the amount of \$2,500. The institution must evaluate all functional areas that impact the determination of initial eligibility and identify weaknesses that increase the risk of incorrect awarding and disbursing.

#### Institution's Response

The error occurred over two years ago and is attributed to human error. The staff member with responsibility has gained more experience since that time to prevent this error from occurring again. The assistant director of financial aid has reviewed the current process for identifying eligible SC LIFE students and has confirmed the process is functioning accurately. The assistant director will continue to monitor the reports to ensure the staff member does not need additional training.

### Reconciliation of SC LIFE Scholarship Program

#### Issues and Concerns

The institution failed to invoice the CHE for SC LIFE scholarships in the amount of \$2,500 each to two students during the 2022-2023 academic year.

#### Recommendation

The institution must implement policies and procedures to ensure the state lottery programs are continuously reconciled at the end of each award period to ensure student disbursements, invoices to the CHE and information reported on CHEMIS agree.

#### Institution's response

The Finance Office will balance the SC LIFE Scholarship account each semester once financial aid is disbursed. Before submitting the invoice to the CHE for reimbursement, the students that were disbursed SC LIFE Scholarship during the semester and general ledger will be compared for accuracy.

The institution must evaluate all functional areas that impact how and when continued eligibility is determined and communicated to scholarship recipients.

#### Institution's Response

The financial aid director has reviewed the current practice for sending notices of ineligibility for funding through the SC Commission on Higher Education. While the notices were sent, it was impossible to recreate the letters to show proof. Since the finding we have implemented a letter

## SC LIFE Scholarship Initial Eligibility (1 of 2)

#### Issues and Concerns

The institution awarded a SC LIFE Scholarship to a student that did not meet two of the three academic requirements for initial eligibility. The student earned at least a 3.0 SC UGP GPA; however, the student did not rank in the top 30% of their graduating class nor did they have the test scores required available.

#### Recommendation

The institution is required to reimburse \$5,000 to the SC LIFE Scholarship Program for improperly awarding funds. The institution must evaluate all functional areas that impact how and when initial eligibility is determined and identify weaknesses that increase the risk of incorrect awarding and disbursing.

#### Institution's Response

USC Upstate has an automated process in Banner for determining SC LIFE Eligibility based on class rank. The staff found there were some issues with the system inaccurately rounding numbers. The staff pulled a list of all students in the 30th percentile to manually verify that accuracy of the Banner report. The student was not on the report for the manual verification, so she was inadvertently missed in final calculations. The USC Columbia campus has been made aware of the potential miscalculations. Moving forward the staff now has access to the CHE website to verify the students who rank in the top 30% of their class.

## SC LIFE Scholarship Initial Eligibility (2 of 2)

#### Issues and Concerns

The institution awarded and disbursed the SC LIFE Scholarship to one student before obtaining a valid high school transcript. After the disbursement of funds, the institution subsequently obtained a valid high school transcript and verified that it was appropriate for the student to receive the SC LIFE scholarship.

#### Recommendation

The institution must evaluate all functional areas that impact how and when initial eligibility is determined and identify weaknesses that increase the risk of incorrect awarding and disbursing.

## Institution's Response:

USC Upstate has changed processes since fall 2022. We now have a staff member assigned to review and verify transcripts before they are scanned into the student record. Our process includes verifying signature, calculation date, and graduation date before it is added to the record to update the student file in banner. All staff members have been trained to verify documents to meet the CHE requirements. The staff is working to secure the final official transcript to update the file for the identified student.

### Palmetto Fellows Scholarship Continued Eligibility

#### Issues and Concerns

The institution was unable to provide evidence that the non-renewal notification was sent to a Palmetto Fellows Scholarship recipient by the end of the Spring 2023 term for not meeting the continued eligibility requirements. The student lost their remaining Palmetto Fellows Scholarship eligibility.

#### Recommendation

The institution must evaluate all functional areas that impact how and when continued eligibility is determined and communicated to scholarship recipients.

#### Institution's Response

The York Technical College Financial Aid Office currently meets with students at the beginning of their enrollment regarding the eligibility criteria for Palmetto Fellows. Additionally, at the conclusion of the Spring term each year, the office will meet with all students that are not meeting continued eligibility requirements where students will sign a memorandum of understanding

regarding the steps required to maintain continued eligibility for the next academic year. After this meeting, students will be referred to the Advising Center for summer registration options to ensure all steps have been exhausted in preparing the student for continued eligibility of Palmetto Fellows.

#### SC LIFE Scholarship Continued Eligibility

#### Issues and Concerns

The institution incorrectly awarded and disbursed \$5,000 for a SC LIFE Scholarship in the 2023-2024 academic year regardless of not meeting the continued eligibility requirements after the 2022-2023 academic year.

#### Recommendation

The institution is required to reimburse the SC LIFE Scholarship Program \$5,000 due to incorrectly disbursement of funds. The institution must evaluate all functional areas that impact how and when continued eligibility is determined and identify weaknesses in current policies and procedures to reduce the risk of incorrect awarding and disbursing.

### Institution's Response

At this time, the Financial Aid Office has conducted a check of all SC LIFE Scholarship students for the 2023-2024 academic year to verify accuracy. No additional errors have been identified. As we are currently in the 2023-2024 academic year, the SC LIFE Scholarship has been removed from the student's account and the student has been notified in writing of their ineligibility status. A report is currently being adapted and updated for the 2024-2025 academic year to better aid our office in confirming the validity of SC LIFE Scholarship students and their continued eligibility.
