# Things to Keep in Mind - Transfer Mobility of Credits (ATCD Model)

1. **A**dmissibility: Refers to the extent to which military experience credit courses determine a transfer student's admission to a university and, when applicable, admission to a specific program within a university.
2. **T**ransferability and **D**egree **A**pplicability-. Refers to the conditions under which a college/university accepts military experience credit courses for inclusion in the student's record.
  - **THINGS TO WORK ON: Take a look at your military equivalences. Work with colleges to consider more direct subject matter equivalencies**
3. **C**ourse **E**quivalency and **T**ransferability: Refers to the process of equating a transfer student's military experience credit courses, both in hours and content, to a university's coursework.
  - **THINGS TO WORK ON: Take a look at transfer equivalences your institution has already established for military credit within current articulation agreements (if any)**
4. **D**egree **A**pplicability: Applicability of credit toward a degree refers to the prerogative of an academic authority to count specific military experience credit courses toward the fulfillment of a student's degree requirements.

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# Best Practices - Transfer Mobility of Credits

Keep in mind the following (ATCD):

1. **Admisibility:** Refers to the extent to which military experience credit courses determine a transfer student's admission to a university and, when applicable, admission to a specific program within a university.

## JOINT STATEMENT ON THE TRANSFER AND AWARD OF CREDIT<sup>1</sup>

- First released in 2001, it was revised in 2017. The current version was issued in December of 2021.
- It provides 8 “...**key considerations** to help colleges and universities implement credit award policies that lead to greater student success and reflect equity-minded practice.”

### Important to Remember:

“...every institution is responsible for determining its own policies and practices with regard to the award of credit, consistent with its individual mission and academic standards....”

“However, **denial of credit without a reasonable basis and clear rationale undermines both students’ and the public’s trust in our system of higher education** as a societal good and a driver of upward mobility.”



# ATCD/JSTAC: Combined Model

Admissibility	Transferability	Course Equivalency	Degree Applicability
1. Standard for evaluating credit should be the same regardless where the learning took place.		2. Credit award should be applied consistently and equitably for all students.	3. Policies should aim to maximize the amount of credit applied to fulfill requirements.
4. Policies/Practices must be reasonable, transparent, and easily understood.			

# Military Prior Learning Inventory

## Question

How are South Carolina institutions currently handling military transfer credit within the ATCD Framework, as viewed through the lens of the Joint Statement on the Transfer and Award of Credit (JSTAC)?

Meta analysis of catalog policies and external facing websites. Followed by an interview with key transfer players at each institution.

## Purpose

To provide a baseline analysis of current policies/procedures. We will not make specific recommendations or judge “good” or “bad”. Each institution can use the results of their study to make internal decisions aligned with their unique mission.

A maximum of 30 semester hours of credit by correspondence and credit awarded for educational experiences in the military may be applied toward meeting the requirements for a baccalaureate degree. The 30 semester hours of credit which may be awarded for educational experiences in the military should be in accordance with recommendations published by the American Council on Education and be consistent with University policy on the transfer of credit but will only be applied to a degree program upon the approval of the dean of the college from which the degree is to be awarded.		
	<b>Transfer Admissions:</b> Applicants with a Joint Services Transcript may receive up to 6 hours of credit toward the required 30 semester hours.	<i>N/A</i>		
	Students transferring from non-accredited colleges may be allowed to validate credit after admission to the University. Details of the validation procedure vary and may be obtained from the dean's office of the college in which the student is enrolled.	<i>N/A</i>

# Who Should Be Involved?


- CHE will not make determinations on which courses equate to military training at your institutions. Faculty are the most important participants in this initiative.
