


The EOC's Role in SC's K-12 Education System

 - Alternative modes of instruction (online, hybrid, face-to-face)
 - Teacher Loan Program
- Make annual Education Improvement Act (EIA) recommendations to the General Assembly
- Produce an Education Data Dashboard (dashboardsc.sc.gov)



Educational Attainment in SC and US


Among adults ages 25-64






SC READY 8rd Grade ELA, SY 23-24




SC READY 8th Grade Math, SY 23-24




End-of-Course Exam Program 2024 Achievement Levels

















Percent of Students Enrolled in College the Fall Immediately After High School by Institutional Type










Enrollment During First Fall Immediately After High School by Dual Enrollment Effective as of: August 21, 2024



Class of 2016 Postsecondary Enrollment and Progress


