Chair Seckinger presented the consent agenda to the Committee and the Committee <u>moved</u> (Munns) and <u>seconded</u> (Edwards) a motion to accept the staff's recommendations for approval. Without further discussion, the Committee <u>voted unanimously to commend favorably to the Commission</u> the consent agenda.

### 6. Program Proposal, University of South Carolina Columbia, M.S., Athletic Training

Chair Seckinger introduced the item and expressed concern the accreditor's requirement of a master's degree to enter the profession will lead to a lack of athletic trainers to service the state's high schools. The Committee <a href="moved">moved</a> (Munns) and <a href="moved">seconded</a> (Edwards) a motion to table the Master of Science in Athletic Training at the University of South Carolina Columbia to until the end of December 2018. The Committee <a href="moved">voted unanimously to table</a> the proposal to until the end of December 2018. Commissioner Jones requested a response to the issue from the University of South Carolina Columbia (USC C) representatives present and asked whether K-12 constituents had been consulted. Dr. Mensch explained currently 88% of all athletic trainers have a master's degree. He continued K-12 was not consulted and only 19% of athletic trainers work in that system.
