Welcome

1. Continuing Awards for *EIA Centers of Excellence (Teacher Education)* Competitive Grants Awards, FY 2020

Vice Chair Seckinger introduced the item and the Committee **moved** (Brown) and **seconded** (Satcher) a motion to accept the staff's recommendation for approval. Dr. Lane reviewed the nature of the EIA Centers of Excellence and their mission: to impact student performance and student attitudes about learning in SC high-needs school districts/schools through unique professional development strategies in recruitment and retention to pre-service and in-service teachers based on identified best practices. Currently, six Centers are sponsored at SC institutions, five through the Commission and one via proviso. They specialize in college and career readiness; minority educator recruitment; research; alternative teacher certification; project-based learning; and teaching children from disadvantaged backgrounds. Dr. Lane summarized the Centers' highlights and the broad scope of their annual activities.
