Palmetto Fellows Scholarship Program 2019-2020 Summary

#### Palmetto Fellows History

The South Carolina General Assembly established the Palmetto Fellows Scholarship Program in 1988 to recognize the most academically talented high school seniors and encourage these students to attend college in the State. From 1988 until 1995, the SC Commission on Higher Education awarded an average of 42 new Palmetto Fellows Scholarships each year. The State awarded \$2,500 per academic year to each recipient, and the institution in which the recipient was enrolled was required to match that amount.

In 1996 the SC General Assembly increased the funding for the program thereby increasing the average number of new Palmetto Fellows Scholarships awarded each year as well as the average award amount. Institutions were no longer required to provide matching funds. With the implementation of the SC Education Lottery in 2002, the General Assembly approved an increase in the maximum Palmetto Fellows Scholarship award amount. Palmetto Fellows may receive up to \$6,700 their first academic year and up to \$7,500 for their second, third, and fourth years for a maximum of eight terms towards their first bachelor's degree at an eligible higher education institution in South Carolina.

#### 2019-20 Palmetto Fellows Report

In 2019-20, the Palmetto Fellows Program was appropriated \$73,809,959 (\$61,809,959 Lottery Funding, \$12,000,000 General Funds/Children's Endowment). The annual data and invoices for the FY2020-21 academic year will not be final until end of 2021 summer term.

#### **Initial Eligibility Requirements**


- Rank in the top 6% at the end of the 10<sup>th</sup>, or the 11<sup>th</sup>, or the 12<sup>th</sup> grade academic year; and
- Earn a 1200 on the SAT or a 27 on the ACT; and
- Earn a 3.5 cumulative GPA (based on SC UGP)


OR qualify by meeting the Alternative Criteria eligibility requirements without regard to rank















- Earn a 1400 on the SAT or a 32 on the ACT; and
- Earn an 4.0 cumulative GPA (based on SC UGP)

#### Palmetto Fellows Scholarship Enhancements

During the 2007 legislative session, the General Assembly created the Palmetto Fellows Scholarship Enhancement. The Scholarship Enhancement increases the Palmetto Fellows Scholarship maximum award from \$7,500 to \$10,000. The enhancement is available to students majoring in the mathematics, science, and health fields at eligible South Carolina four-year institutions. Eligible students can be awarded a Palmetto Fellows Scholarship Enhancement to meet their cost of attendance for up to six consecutive terms starting the second year of college enrollment.

#### To be eligible for the Scholarship Enhancement a student must:

- Be a recipient of the Palmetto Fellows Scholarship; and
- Earn at least 14 credit hours of instruction in approved mathematics or life and physical sciences or a combination of both by the end of the first academic year of college enrollment; and
- Declare an approved major in science, mathematics, or health related field at the institution.

## **Continued Eligibility**

In order to maintain the Palmetto Fellows Scholarship each academic year, a student must earn 30 credit hours and maintain a 3.0 cumulative institutional GPA. Students cannot use credit hours earned in AP, IB, CLEP, or Dual enrollment towards their annual 30 credit hour requirement.

#### 2019-20 High School Cohort Attendance at in-state and out-of-state institutions

In 2019-20, during the open award periods, high school counselors from public, independent, charter virtual, and home school associations submitted a total of 3,628 Palmetto Fellow applications. Of the 3,628 applicants, 3,405 students met the academic criteria to be considered a Palmetto Fellow.

When students are determined to be an eligible Palmetto Fellows, they receive an e-mail with a link to the Designation Form. Eligible students are responsible for submitting the Designation Form to notify CHE where they will be attending during the Fall term. As of October 15, 2020:

o 2,709 students have completed the Designation Form

- 2,514 have selected in-state colleges and universities
- 159 have elected to attend an out-of-state institution
- 17 students took a GAP year
- 19 students have forfeited their scholarship to attend a two-year institution\* o 696 students did not complete the Designation form

\*During the 2020-2021 legislative session, language has been introduced to allows students to use Palmetto Fellows Scholarship at two-year technical institutions.

As seen in Table 3, Clemson University has the highest number of new Palmetto Fellows with USC in second place. Almost every institution in South Carolina received at least one Palmetto Fellow with the exception of Allen University, Benedict College, Columbia College, Morris College, South Carolina State University and Voorhees College.

Table 4 illustrates the out-of-state college or university selection for the 159 students who have elected not to attend a South Carolina institution. The top ten colleges and universities included: North Carolina State University (7 students), Duke University (6 students), Auburn University (5 students), Georgia Institute of Technology (5 students), University of Alabama (5 students), Belmont University (4 students), University of Georgia (4 students), University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill (4 students), Western Carolina University (4 students), and Yale University (4 students).
