# 1. Welcome

Dr. Berry welcomed everyone to the meeting at 10:00 a.m.

# 2. Introductions, Quorum, and Freedom of Information Act

Ms. Solet announced attendance, established quorum, and confirmed the meeting was being held in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act.

# 3. Approval of Agenda

Dr. Berry called for a motion to approve the meeting agenda. A motion was made and seconded. Dr. Berry called for a vote. **The motion passed unopposed.** 

# 4. Approval of Minutes

Dr. Berry called for a motion to approve the January 9, 2025 meeting minutes. A motion was made and seconded. Dr. Berry called for a vote. **The motion passed unopposed**.

# 5. Transferability of South Carolina Technical College System's New Program Proposal

a. Midlands Technical College, A.A.S. in Integrated Information Technology Dr. Berry explained the new program proposal, which was submitted as non-transferable, had previously been put to an electronic review by ACAP members to determine transferability, which resulted in a tie vote. Therefore, Ms. Solet took a roll call vote, which resulted in 13 votes for program transferability and 3 votes for non-transferability. Discussion was had and Dr. Berry noted CHE staff would review the proposal and work toward placement on a subsequent ACAP agenda for program review.

# 6. New Program Proposals

- a. <u>University of South Carolina Columbia</u>, D.N.P. in Nursing Education
  The institution moved approval of the program, which was seconded. The program was presented, and the floor opened to questions. Hearing none, Dr. Berry called for a vote to recommend the program to CAAL for review. The motion passed unopposed.
- b. <u>South Carolina State University</u>, B.S. in Computer Engineering
  The institution moved approval of the program, which was seconded. The program was presented, and the floor opened to questions. Discussion was had regarding certification of REACH Act compliance, which both the institution and Dr. Berry confirmed is in the proposal. USC Columbia expressed support of the program. Hearing no further questions or comments, Dr. Berry called for a vote to recommend the program to CAAL for review. The motion passed unopposed.

  The institution moved approval of the program, which was seconded. The program was presented, and the floor opened to questions. Hearing none, Dr. Berry called for a vote to recommend the program to CAAL for review. **The motion passed unopposed**.

USC Beaufort expressed appreciation for the institution's reduction in credit hours for the programs, which Winthrop agreed makes the programs more attractive. Further discussion was had regarding the REACH Act language used in the proposal. The institution agreed to make the suggested edits. With no further questions or comments, Dr. Berry called for a vote to approve the modifications presented as agenda items 7.a. – 7.d. The motion passed unopposed.
