The University of South Carolina Beaufort is situated in the South Carolina Lowcountry, close to two major military installations. Over the years, USCB offered general education courses leading to the AA/AS degrees at the two military installations to address the needs of military personnel. When USCB became a 4-year baccalaureate degree-granting institution in 2004, AA/AS degrees were no longer available to USCB students. However, in a letter dated July 19, 2004 (attached), the SCCHE gave USCB approval to offer the AA/AS degrees at the Marine Corp Air Station (MCAS) and the Parris Island Marine Corp Recruit Depot (MCRD). USCB offered classes in a traditional format on the bases until classroom renovations began at both installations, forcing USCB to shift the classes to the Beaufort campus. However, the instructional sites remained open. In 2019, the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) urged USCB to close both instructional sites. USCB wishes to “officially close the sites” on the installations but continue to honor our commitment to the military by offering the AA/AS programs on the USCB campuses using traditional, hybrid, and 100% online formats. The university’s mission emphasizes its commitment to the region and meeting regional needs. Continuation of the AA/AS degree programs aligns with USCB’s mission and supports active-duty military personnel. USCB has earned the following designations for being military-friendly:

- Military Friendly School: Gold (22-23)
- Military Friendly Spouse School (22-23)
- Top Colleges for Veterans, Consensus Ranked

The AA/AS degrees are available only to active-duty military personnel and their dependents. Due to changes at the bases, on-site delivery is no longer permissible. The university has a strong commitment to active-duty personnel and remains a key partner with local military installations. In fact, USCB has a full-time Director of Military Programs who splits his time between the two bases. The university seeks to offer the existing AA/AS degrees on the USCB campuses in a traditional, hybrid, or 100% online option. This will allow the university to continue to support active-duty military personnel who may be in the region for a limited period or assigned a new duty station outside the region and allow them to complete a degree.
